



## KODAK'S PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP – WASTE REDUCTION

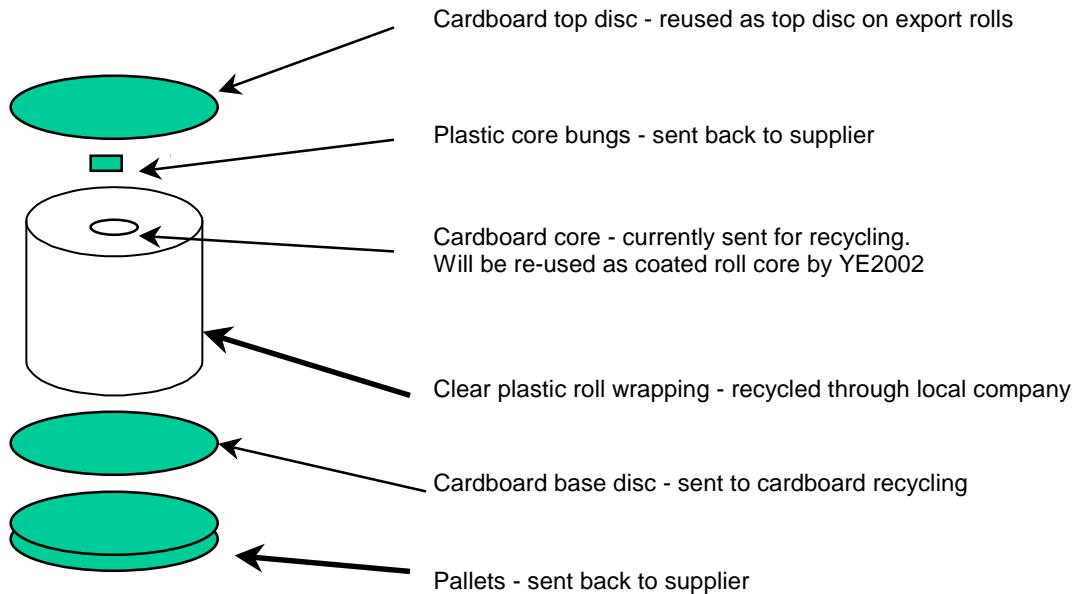
### MANUFACTURING

Kodak is continually looking for ways to reduce waste from its manufacturing processes. One of our recent projects involved looking at ways of reducing waste from our bulk roll paper coating processes.

### BULK ROLL COATING OPERATION

To evaluate opportunities for reuse and recycling, the roll management group systematically examined the components of the bulk roll. Bulk rolls can weigh up to two tonnes and can be up to six kilometres long. The bulk rolls form the basis for photographic paper manufacture. They are manufactured overseas and have many packaging components to ensure the roll is protected during manufacture and transport. The roll management team discovered that virtually all of the roll's components and packaging was reusable or recyclable.

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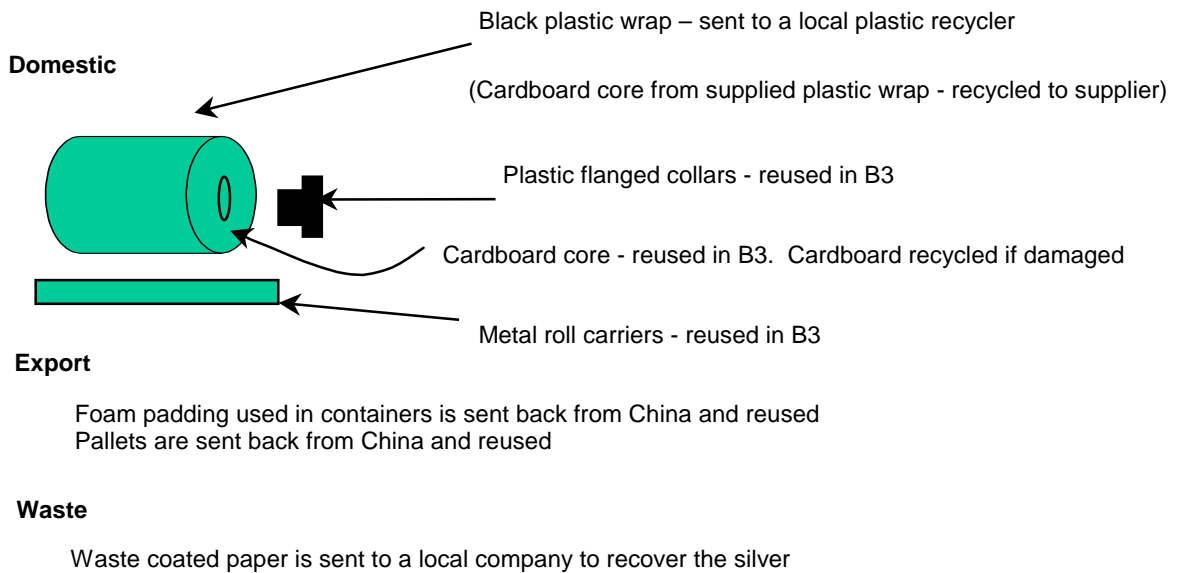
### THE NATIONAL PACKAGING COVENANT

The Packaging Covenant is seen at Kodak as an opportunity for further improvement in environmental management, and in the goals of sustainable development and product stewardship. The packaging covenant ties in with our policy to continually reassess our processes to evaluate environmental performance.

### FURTHER PROCESSING

When our facility has finished our paper coating process the roll is slit into small useable pieces. The components of the roll can then be further collected and reused or recycled. The roll's core, metal carriers, and plastic flanged collars can all be reused in manufacturing new rolls. Offcuts of coated paper are kept for silver recovery, and imported packaging is re-exported for reuse.
