



KODAK'S PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP - RECYCLING

Kodak's is committed to delivering products to our customers that are of the highest quality, while minimising adverse environmental aspects. Since signing the National Packaging Covenant, we have reaffirmed this commitment and we are taking continuous steps towards achieving our environmental goals.

ON-SITE RECYCLING

Kodak has introduced recycling programs for many of the wastes from its manufacturing and processing operations. We have introduced recycling programs for:

- Polyethylene "shrink wrap" and plastic sheet from across the site.
- Cardboard cartons from all areas.
- Plastic film caps and cans, and steel film cassettes from our processing facilities
- Film tabs from our processing labs are sent for silver recovery and film base recovery.
- Office paper recycling.
- Cardboard, plastic, glass, and metals recycling.
- Steel and plastic recycling of 35mm cassette manufacturing off-cuts.
- Spent fluorescent tubes.
- Cleaned plastic chemical bottles.
- Recovery of silver from photographic paper slitting operations.
- Bulk roll components reused or recycled.
- Waste lubricating oils sent off-site for recycling.

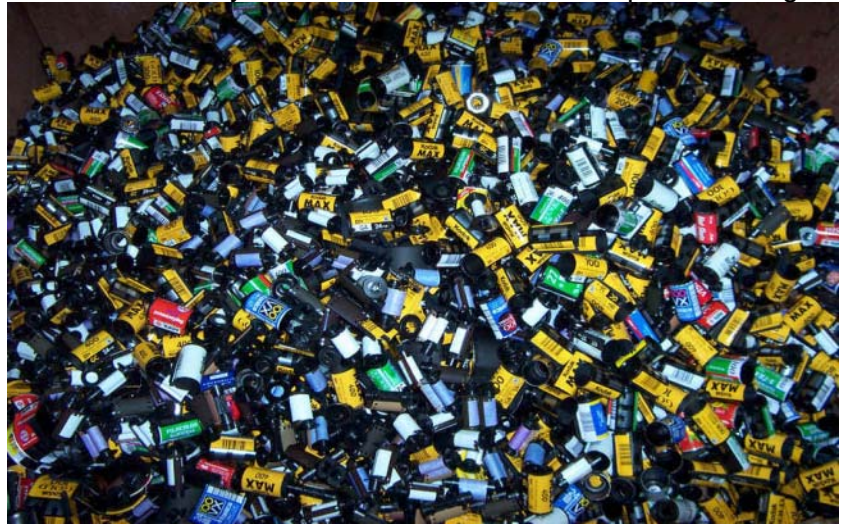
RECYCLING

At Kodak we are working to make packaging more recyclable. We are also establishing

programs to increase the recycling rate of waste from our operations, and to use more recycled materials in our products.

KODAK PRODUCTS

Our commitment to product stewardship means that our products are designed to ensure that they minimise environmental impacts through



their entire life cycle. Our engineers take environmental considerations into account when designing or refining products and processes. For example our One Time Use Cameras are designed to be easily reused/recycled. The program continues to grow and has become the most successful consumer product recycling and reuse effort worldwide, with over three million One Time Use Cameras recycled from Australia so far, and over two hundred million units recycled around the world. We have now locked the concept of product stewardship into our Environmental Management System in Australia and our goal is to improve our performance every day...every month...and every year.
